Am I registered to vote?	Check your voter registration status online at IdahoVotes.gov . Click Voting>Am I registered to vote?>enter county, your name, then click Select.
Where do I vote?	Check your voting location online at IdahoVotes.gov . Click Voting> Where do I go to vote? > enter your address and click Next.
Voter I.D. requirements	Registered voters must present a photo I.D. or sign a Personal Identification Affidavit
Absentee voting	Registered voters can submit an absentee ballot before Nov 6. Request an absentee ballot from the Lemhi County Clerk’s office by Oct. 26 deadline. Visit IdahoVotes.gov for details.

Aaron Swisher (D) for U.S.

Congress – ID Congressional District 2

★★★ Propositions ★★★

Idaho Proposition 1 –Historical Horse Racing Initiative

Authorizes historical horse racing at certain locations where live or simulcast horse racing occurs and allocating revenue therefrom.

This legislation is not actually about horse racing...it's about historical horse racing **machines**. It would legalize and allow these machines to be installed anywhere in the state While there may be some benefits to the initiative, its tie with big money business, and the lack of transparency around distribution of incomes, makes this initiative questionable.

Lemhi County Democrats recommend voting AGAINST Proposition 1

Idaho Proposition 2 – Medicaid Eligibility Expansion Initiative

An initiative to provide that the State shall amend its State Plan to expand Medicaid eligibility to certain persons.

The Medicaid Eligibility Expansion Initiative was brought to the ballot by thousands of volunteers signing petitions to bring health coverage to their families and neighbors caught in the "Gap" - hard-working folks who do not make enough to get their insurance through the Exchange.
